

Peak District Poor Law Settlement and Removal Papers (SURNAMES M-Z)

In 1601, the *Act for the Relief of the Poor* was passed (commonly known as the 'Old Poor Law'). Under the Old Poor Law, the *parish* was established as the basic administrative unit responsible for poor relief with parish officials known as 'Overseers of the Poor' tasked with collecting poor rates from ratepayers in the parish and allocating relief to those in need.

The poor relief system soon brought about the increased movement of destitute people to regions where ratepayers were wealthier and poor relief funds therefore greater. The issues this created led to the *Settlement Act* (passed in 1662). Under this act, anyone legally 'settled' in a parish had a right to claim poor relief from it, others did not and could be 'removed' to another parish deemed to be responsible for them. Qualification for legal 'settlement' within a parish was most frequently determined by an individual's parentage or marriage, although claims could also depend on location of jobs and value of property.

The main documents created by the settlement system were **settlement certificates**, **settlement examinations** and **removal orders**. The survival of such records is very patchy, but, where they do survive (often in Church 'parish chest' records or local court/solicitors records held at local authority archives services) they can be of great value to family and social historians, offering a fascinating window onto the lives of working classes/paupers, showing the migration of people and sometimes intriguing 'potted biographies' of individuals.

The following list provides an index to Poor Law settlement and removal papers relating to the Peak District held in local authority archives, arranged in alphabetical order by surname and including document type, date, original document reference, etc. The list is an ongoing process and will be updated regularly.
